## Here's your chance to work on an archaeological project: places still available in the City College excavation class



You can join San Diego City College students in the ongoing excavations at the Peñasquitos Ranch. The excavations take place on Fridays from 10:00 AM to 4:00PM, and the class meets on Wednesdays from 12:45 to 3:45 PM in the Anthropology Lab on the City College campus for lecture and cataloging of artifacts. August 25 is the first class (on-campus lab), and there are no prerequisites. Students in Anthropology 115 are exploring a 19th century adobe structure discovered in excavation in 2015. This is a face-to-face class, and students must provide proof of vaccination. A detailed safety plan will be followed to reduce risks to participants.

The excavation class is one of five

classes required for the Certificate of Achievement in Archaeology. Three of the four other classes needed for the certificate are also being offered this semester: Anthropology 103 (Introduction to Cultural Anthropology), 107 (Introduction to Archaeology), and 210 (Introduction to California Indians). The certificate opens the door to employment as a field or lab technician for archaeological consulting companies. Demand for archaeological technicians was strong during the pandemic, and that demand continues today.
